Did You Know?

Mothers and children fleeing violence in Honduras, Guatemala and El Salvador have come to the United States seeking asylum. Once here, they are being held in detention centers while they await their hearings.

Imagine being an infant or small child who travels with your terrified mother to the United States only to be put in a detention center housing unit with bunk beds for 12 with other moms and kids. Imagine being a mom trying to console your child in this chaotic situation.

There are three "family residential detention centers" in the U.S. located in: Karnes City, Texas; Dilley, Texas; and Berks County, Pennsylvania. The name sounds like these centers are a haven for families, but the mothers and children are not free to leave. **This spring, the population of babies and toddlers under the age of two held in Dilley, Texas suddenly grew from three to nearly 100!**
