

IPL and OTOC for Temporary Protected Status



Thirty-five TPS holders attended a workshop with Immigrant Legal Center lawyer Gary Walters and IPL on Saturday, Feb. 2. With the Trump administration cancelling TPS for Salvadorans in September 2019, long time TPS holders are concerned about how they can remain in the US with their citizen children. TPS and IPL leaders are working with local lawyers to help these families learn about their options for staying in the United States if TPS is finally terminated.



OTOC and IPL leaders hosted a Despedia or send off for a group of nine Nebraskans that went to Washington DC for the TPS People's Summit and March for TPS Justice. More than 100 people gathered to bless the travelers, celebrate the value immigrants bring to our communities, and build relationships with new people
